



BACKGROUND ... the early days.

The Early Days (1900's)

In the early days of Mullumbimby, settlers dotted the green countryside with their dairy farms and banana plantations beneath the shadow of a mountain called Chincogan. There were no resident priests and the Eucharist was celebrated in a room at the Railway Hotel by a visiting priest. Prior to 1917 St John's Parish was part of Bangalow Parish.

The foundation stone of the Catholic Church, Mullumbimby was laid on May 13, 1906, by the late Bishop Doyle. At this particular period Dean Welsh was in charge of the district.

In 1910 a cottage near the Railway Station was acquired for a convent and the first community of 3 Sisters of St Joseph arrived to teach 28 children in a room adjoining the new brick church. A new wooden convent was built on the hill above the church about 1911, and the Sisters moved in. Unfortunately, the whole convent was burnt down and the Sisters had to reside at Mr Gerald O'Conner's home for some days.

Mr Dan Buckley gave his house and three blocks for the present convent until on April 18, 1920 Rev Monsignor McGuire V.G. laid the foundation stone of the new brick convent. This was built by Fr McEvoy while Fr Williams, the Parish Priest, was on leave in Ireland.

There was no bridge across the Brunswick River and Mass times had to coincide with the tide so the people could get across on foot or in their buggies.

The School opened in 1910, and the new Convent and Presbytery erected and opened in 1920. All the buildings were brick and were positioned in the picturesque surroundings overlooking the magnificent Brunswick River. The School, Convent and Presbytery were constructed under the direction of Rev Richard (Dick)Williams, (1917) the first Parish Priest of St John's Parish Mullumbimby.

When the Rev. Father Williams died in retirement at the age of 80 years last week (see page 8) his constant companion, a lively little Irish terrier named Paddy, crawled underneath his master's bed and refused to be comforted.

For five days he touched neither food nor drink and resisted every temptation to come out.

On Tuesday morning, still lying under the bed, Paddy died.

In life, Father Williams and the deg were inseparable.

Pioneer Priest, Aged 80, Dies In Retirement


A pioneer and respected priest of the Lismore diocese, iffey. Father R. H. Williams, died at Neutral Bay, in retirement Wednesday, May 20, at the age of 80 years.

For the past year Father Willams was born 'at Rathmines, Dublin (Ireland), in August 80 years ago. He was educated at Blackrock College, and then went to St. Sulpice College, Paris, and from there was selected to continue his studies at Rome, where he attended the Gregorian Seminary. In September, 1885, he was ordained in Paris by his Grace Archbishop Leroy, in the Church of the Holy Ghost, and he then returned to Dublin and was appointed professor of Summerhill College, West Ireland, and after about nine years went to Armagh College. Father Williams came to New South Wales about 38 years ago, and was appointed to the Lismore diocese, where he worked in different parishes until selected as the first pastor of Mullumbimby.

The affection in which Father Williams was held by the parishioners of Mullumbimby was manifest on the occasion of his retirement

or the occasion of his retirement from that parish in October, 1938, when he was entertained by priests and people, and presented with a wallet of notes and a chalice.

An inspiring panegyric was preached at the close of the Mass by the Provincial of the Vincentian Fathers, the Very Rev. Father R. Macken, C.M., who paid a graceful tribute to the labors of Father Williams during his years in Ireland and his missionary life in the Lismore diocese. Lismore diocese.







A tribute to our local Priest...

Fr Bill Mills

9 September 1929 - 26 March 2017

Fr Bill's childhood was spent on the family dairy farm in Main Arm. In the early days of his life, church and school played a very big part in Fr Bill's formation and training. Of those days, Fr Bill wrote that above all he remembered the kind and compassionate Sisters of St Joseph who had a calming and soothing influence throughout his years of schooling. After primary school Fr Bill moved onto the strict discipline of seminary life. The story goes that Fr. O'Byrne was doing the rounds when he called in on Fr Bill's parents, Bill and Lizzie Mills. He stridently announced that with nine boys that one should go to the seminary. Fr Bill used to add to the story that his dad said to Fr. O'Byrne, 'you can have Bill he can't milk'. Fr Bill remains the only parishioner of St John's to have been ordained a priest. Fr Bill was so very good to St John's Parish. He had a love of both churches and enjoyed saying Mass at Brunswick Heads and Mullumbimby. Fr Bill would always reinforce the need for the people to be responsible for making the parish work. On the Saturday before he died he said that he wanted to say just one more Mass at St John's - and how we would have loved that.



He was a wonderful reflector on life who kept up to date with emerging theology. Fr Bill generously and with ongoing dedication shared his gift of being able to speak the word of God in a way that stretched the hearer, inspiring him/her to go deeper.

Fr Bill took a very special interest in our Aged Care facility, Coolamon Villa. He said a monthly Mass for residents and all were most welcome at these Masses. Many not of our faith attended because he was committed to sharing the love of God with everyone and also committed to anointing the elderly, frail and sick. Fr Bill was real and related to people in their real situations - he met the people where they were.

Over 60 years of priesthood Fr Bill was often the person who shared a word or a gesture that became the turning point for another person's life. He radiated the love of God because he was friends with God in a most intimate way.

Fr Bill lived the resurrection of Jesus and he preached a Risen, gentle, hope filled Christ to all whom he met, loved and served. Fr Bill always said that we die to many things in our lives, we can often be entombed and our lives in despair, which is really a measure of our distance from God. Then God loves us back into life and resurrection.






