A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

See that you are prepared.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'See that you are dressed for action and have your lamps lit. Be like men waiting for their master to return from the wedding feast, ready to open the door as soon as he comes and knocks.

Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. I tell you solemnly, he will put on an apron, sit them down at table and wait on them. It may be in the second watch he comes, or in the third, but happy those servants if he finds them ready.

You may be quite sure of this, that if the householder had known at what hour the burglar would come, he would not have let anyone break through the wall of his house.

You too must stand ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Reflection

In the middle of Ordinary Time we discover a theme normally associated with the end of the liturgical year and the season of Advent – vigilance in anticipation of the return of the master. This vigilance demands that we live lives of faith. We do not know when God will open the door of our existence and call us into a deeper realisation of the sacred dimension of life itself. Vigilance is a characteristic of a Christian at all times, for all times. We must be ever vigilant.

While we live in the expectation of the coming of God in the future, we also live now in the presence of God. This means that God is present with us now, as a companion in our lives. It also means that this presence is the context within which our lives unfold. However, until all things are brought to fulfilment, we live in this presence by faith. Faith and hope are intimately joined. As believers we are called to trust in the promises of God, even when what is promised seems impossible.

We are assured that we will be blessed, but we can never be sure of the exact nature of the blessing. In faith, we put our trust in God and then carry out our responsibilities. In faith we wait for the Lord, who is our help and our shield, not really knowing under what guise he will come to us. Faith is both the cost of living as a disciple and the reward.



JUBILEE YEAR 2025 - The Good Ship Hope

The Church's Jubilee tradition dates back to the year 1300, when Pope Boniface VIII declared the first

Holy Year. Originally held once every 100 years, Jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years as special times of renewal, pilgrimage, and grace.

As part of this Jubilee year, a symbolic pilgrimage is taking place through The Good Ship 'Hope' – a beautifully crafted boat inspired by the official Jubilee logo. Designed and built by our talented Newman College furniture teacher, Peter Hayes, the vessel has journeyed across the Lismore Diocese, beginning at Camden Haven Catholic Parish and concluding at St Joseph's Parish in Tweed Heads, before returning home to Newman College.

NAIDOC WEEK @ St John's

In Week 3 we celebrated NAIDOC Week, which was organised by Aliya King, our Indigenous Education Worker, along with the Koorie Kids at St John's.

The week was initiated by an opening ceremony, teachers were provided with a myriad of great resources to implement in the classroom and there were various activities throughout the week to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Cultures; such as a colouring in competition, poetry competition, Koorie Storytime, Sports competitions at break times, damper and tea at break times, colour dress day.

The 2025 theme is *The Next Generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy*. NAIDOC Week 2025 marked a powerful milestone: 50 years of NAIDOC Week, honouring and elevating Indigenous voices, culture and resilience. The NAIDOC committee chose this theme to celebrate "...not only the achievements of the past but also the bright future ahead, empowered by the strength of our young leaders, the vision of our communities, and the legacy of our ancestors."



The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is celebrated every year on August 15.

This feast commemorates the belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken body and soul into Heaven.

The doctrine was formally defined as a dogma of the Catholic Church in 1950 through the apostolic constitution "Munificentissimus Deus".



It declares: "the bodily Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven — which, regarding the heavenly glorification of the virginal body of the august Mother of God, could not be known by any human faculty with its natural forces alone — is a truth revealed by God, and therefore all the faithful of the Church must firmly and faithfully believe it" (12).
