"I am here among you as one who serves." Luke 22:27

Today's Gospel

John 15:1-8 All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.

Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more.

You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you.

Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away – he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it.

It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'



Jesus will remain with us always

Today's Gospel reading is taken from middle of the Last Supper discourse. Jesus speaks about his relationship to his disciples. In his metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is referencing the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and God himself tends the vineyard. One of the primary themes of John's Gospel is to show Jesus to be the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel.

In this passage, Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death; he will remain with them always. This unity between Jesus and his disciples is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that he began. Similarly, Jesus' presence with us through the Gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to continue the work of

National Domestic Violence Remembrance Day Wednesday 1 May

National Domestic Violence Remembrance Day, is a day to remember the women and children who have tragically lost their lives to domestic violence.

Candlelight vigils will be held across the country in memoriam and to help bring light to this national crisis.

Minister for Women and the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, Jodie Harrison, said domestic and family violence has become endemic across NSW, and it needs to stop now.

"Domestic and family violence has plagued our nation for long enough and our government is determined to end this blight on our society," Ms Harrison said."As we mourn those who have lost their lives due to violence, I stand in solidarity with our victim-survivors and families who grieve loved ones in the hope that one day, no woman or child

will ever need to live with domestic and family violence."

Violence against women and their children costs the Australian economy an estimated \$26 billion each year.

In 2022, there were 33,410 reports of domestic violence related assault and 11 murders of women and children in NSW alone.

In the last 10 years to 2022, there were 207 murders of women and children in NSW, while 64 women were murdered in Australia in 2023.

It is also estimated that around 1 in 4 Australian women have experienced some form of violence committed by an intimate partner since the age of 15.

love and reconciliation that he began. Jesus also teaches his disciples about the importance of the words he has taught to them. Just as Jesus will remain in the disciples, so too will his words. We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the living Word of God. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. This commitment is also strengthened by our life of prayer and nourished by the Eucharist. Through the Eucharist, Jesus dwells in us, remains with us, and transforms us so that we might bear fruit in his name.

We observe many people who act in ways that show their commitment to serve their neighbor. Christians and non-Christians feed the hungry, care for the sick, shelter the homeless, and give alms to the poor. These actions become acts of Christian discipleship when they are motivated by our relationship with Jesus. Whatever the immediate results, Jesus promises us that these actions will bear fruit when we undertake them in his name.


